ANNOUNCEMENTS BY MAYOR AND COUNCIL

Mayor Brown announced that there are some cool things coming to the City of Cache. First is the celebration for the country's 250th birthday on the 4th of July. There will be 2 live bands, River Rose and Bobby Dell Bands. Fireworks will start at 9:30, "C" Ave will be closed off for the celebration. There will be advertising on KSWO and on KLA W Radio.

Splash pad is up and running again, the drinking fountain is working again. The West Cache Creek bridge is being worked on will road will be closed for repairs. The pickle ball court will be repairing the fence and net from the city workers.

Councilman Red Elk stated that ISO will be doing inspections of the hydrants and they will be out and about the city inspecting them starting in August. Different hydrants will be releasing water.

CITIZENS PARTICIPATION:

Scott Fraley from Community Action Development Corporation presented to council that they are traveling grocery stores to food desert areas. Stated that Cache was on their list and wanted to visit with council regarding their service. They will be bringing a 42-foot trailer full of various items to purchase from dry goods to freezer, cold items, fresh fruits and vegetables. The purpose is to help communities that travel to grocery stores for the elderly and homebound communities. They would like to come to the City Park 2 times a month, Monday through Friday. More details to come after they get their schedules and will be posted on our website with those dates and times. Sales tax generated from sales will stay in our town.

Donna Lumpkin stated that they finally have been federally funded through Lisa Grant. She stated that she is applying for grants for community garden and was wondering if the city had any property that could be established accordingly. Also, for the 250th birthday she would like to get a time capsule for the City of Cache. Councilman Red Elk stated that they were wanting to move the flagpole south of the fire station that could be embedded in the base of the flagpole. Council seem to think that would be a good place for the capsule.

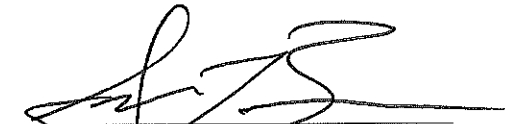
